Our panel:

Ingrid ten Bruggenkate, MSW RSW, is the Social Worker for the inpatient Neurosciences unit at the Kingston General Hospital. She sees patients in the acute stage of recovery to assess needs, provide support, and plan for future services which may be required.

Dr. Karen Smith, MD FRCPC, is a Physiatrist with the Providence Care Acquired Brain Injury Program at St. Mary's of the Lake Hospital. Dr. Smith is an essential component of the rehabilitation

program for those in the post-acute stage, working to help restore function and ability after injury.

Bill Gibson, MSW RSW, is the Social Worker with the Providence Care Acquired Brain Injury Program at St. Mary's of the Lake Hospital. He provides assessments, education and adjustment and resource counselling, and helps to coordinate services upon discharge from hospital.

Carol Rogers, MSW RSW, is the Social Worker with the Child Development Centre Acquired Brain Injury Team at Hotel Dieu Hospital in Kingston. She provides support to children who have sustained an ABI, as well as their families.

Dr. Martin Logan, C. Psych., is the Neuropsychologist with the Providence Care Regional Community Brain Injury Services. He provides clinical oversight to the program and neuropsychological assessments for the purposes of service planning.

Nancy McFadyen, MSc. OT Reg, is an Occupational Therapist in private practice near Smiths Falls. She sees clients in the community, providing needs assessments, cognitive rehabilitation, and client-centred ABI education for families about the impact of brain injury.
