Course Outline

Day 1: Ted Newbigging, BSc. founder and executive director of Paradigm Rehabilitation and Nursing Services Inc and Paradigm Residential Inc and Christina Versteeg, B.Sc. Clinical Coordinator, Paradigm Rehabilitation and Nursing Services

Behaviour Level 1: An Introduction to Behaviour Analysis. Participants will gain an enhanced understanding of behavioural sequelae following ABI.

Behaviour Level 2: A deeper exploration of Behaviour Analysis. Participants will expand their knowledge of the concepts introduced in Behaviour Level 1.

Day 2: Tamara Forbes, B.Kin Rehabilitation Case Manager Forbes Health Management will join Ted Newbigging and Christina Versteeg.

Teaching Skills: This interactive work-shop will provide participants with the opportunity to develop and enhance their understanding and capacity in the areas of rapport building and teaching skills as they relate to their work with the ABI population.

Standards of Practice: Workshop participants will be introduced to standards of professionalism and client care in the field of rehabilitation therapy. Topics will also include ethical decision making.

Day 3: Tamara Forbes, B.Kin

Cognitive Level 1: Participants will have the opportunity to engage in an Inter-active workshop, designed to explore the cognitive deficits following brain injury and the most effective approaches to assist clients in compensating for these impairments.

Cognitive Level 2: The second part of this workshop will focus on Rehabilitation Therapist's role in assisting clients with cognitive deficits resulting from brain injuries. Case examples, generated by participants, will be utilized to develop a "tool box" of strategies for client and worker

Day 4: Dr. Lindy Kilik, Ph.D., C.Psych, Neuropsychologist, Geriatric Psychiatry, Providence Care

Brain Anatomy: Participants will develop an increased understanding of functional neuroanatomy and brain behavior relationships as well as an understanding of some of the physical issues commonly associated with acquired brain injury.
