	Pain is often a common issue for people post brain injury and may be experienced as headaches, pressure in your head, neck pain and many other ways and in other areas of the body. Dr. Sequeira is a specialist in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Parkwood Institute and during this session he will talk about these issues and possible treatment options.
April 26 th	Brain Injury and the Practice of Mindfulness Speaker: Lisa McCorquodale
	This session will introduce and discuss the practice of mindfulness and the benefits mindfulness may provide in reducing and/or coping with the emotional, cognitive and psychosocial changes that are experienced as the result of sustaining a brain injury.
May 3 rd	Life After Brain Injury – Reintroducing Leisure into your Lifestyle Speakers: April Zehr, Therapeutic Recreation Specialist Nadia Andretta Whelan, Therapeutic Recreation Specialist
	This session will look to help individuals examine adjusting to new lifestyles that may follow impairments from a brain injury with a focus on leisure participation. Often there are few, if any, new leisure pursuits initiated to replace past interests. Leisure activities are an important area of concern for brain injury survivors and may have the potential to assist with recovery in other areas.
