#### Dr. Abraham Sniderman MD, FRCP(C)

“Wires and Sparks: Behavioural and Emotional Issues in TBI.” This presentation will address the basic concepts and clinical presentation of the different behavioural and emotional dysregulation syndromes, commonly seen in acquired brain injury. By the end of the presentation the audience should be able to distinguish the different syndromes and some aspects of their management. Dr. Sniderman is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and the Department of Medicine at the University of Toronto. He is the director of the Neuropsychiatry Clinic at the Toronto Rehabilitation Institute, Neuro-rehabilitation Program where he has worked for the past 20 years. He is an instructor in the undergraduate program at the Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto, and resident supervisor in the consultation Liason Program. Dr. Sniderman is a member of the Exam Board and an examiner in Psychiatry for the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons.



#### Dr. Jessica Trier MD, FRCP(C)

Dr. Trier’s presentation will focus on ‘hot topics’ in concussion care and symptom management. Dr. Trier is an assistant professor at Queen’s University, and has been working at Providence Care since 2014. She is the Medical Director of the Acquired Brain Injury Rehabilitation Program. Her primary area of clinical practice is in acquired brain injury, but she also has an interest in electro-diagnostic and musculoskeletal medicine. Current areas of research include physical activity after acquired brain injury, management of tinnitus after traumatic brain injury, and medical education, including the transition to Competency-Based Medical Education.

### Sergio Di Giovanni Qcard Founder, ABI Survivor

Sergio Di Giovanni, Q Card founder and ABI survivor. He will share his inspiring story about the motor vehicle accident that changed his life, his journey to recovery and how it lead him to develop Qcard: a mobile app designed to improve the quality of life for brain injury survivors. Qcard has been featured in publications, recommended by OT’s, Psychiatrists and Neurologists. It has been adopted by the American Congress of Rehabilitation and survivors are raving about it!

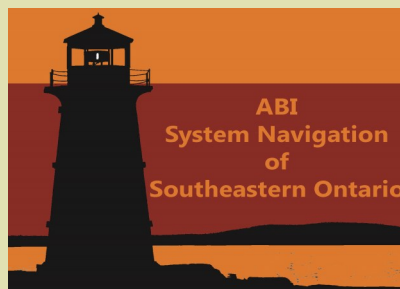
